- Guest Speaker Amy McPherson, Alisa Ann Ruch Burn Foundation
 - At age 8, Alisa Ann Ruch was fatally injured in a backyard barbeque accident. Alisa's parents partnered with Southern California firefighters to found the Alisa Ann Ruch Burn Foundation, a 501(c) (3) nonprofit organization in 1971. Their programs include:
 - Burn Prevention which is dedicated to preventing burn injuries through education. This program includes: Scald Prevention; Fire Fighters in Safety Education; Stop, Drop & Roll; and Cool-A-Burn.
 - Survivor Support connects survivors with resources for coping with and managing their injuries, and engages them in a loving community of peers. This program includes: Hospital Support; Support Groups; Peer Support; School Re-Entry; Ellwood And Louise "Bridge To Life" Scholarship; Resources and Referrals
 - Camps & Recreation provide a supportive atmosphere among burn survivors that encourages self-acceptance and fun. This program includes: Champ Camp; Young Adult Summit; The Getaway; Burn Survivor Events
 - AARBF has locations in Burbank, Fresno, and San Francisco
